- lessons learnt from radiotherapy incidents/ accidents.
- education and training on risk management in radiotherapy.

CALL FOR PAPERS

The workshop programme will comprise oral presentations given by the ACCIRAD partners, keynote presentations given by invited speakers, and poster presentations of contributed papers.
